Maintenance Report

- Three roofs were replaced this year. All roofs at Arlington have now been replaced within the last couple of years.
- All cracks in the street surfaces will be repaired in the coming weeks. This regular maintenance will prolong the life of our asphalt. We will need your cooperation with vehicles during these repairs. There will be blocks of time where certain areas of the streets and parking lot will not be accessible to vehicles. Notices will be posted in advance of the repair.

Occupancy

Each of the Townhome units is intended to be used for single-family residential housing and is subject to the requirements of local, state, and federal laws. There are no restrictions based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status (families with children under 18), or disability. Provo City zoning ordinances currently limit occupancy to one family or three unrelated single persons per Townhome.

There will be a \$1,500 fine per month for over occupancy.

Motorcycle Noise

As written in the Arlington Place Declaration of Covenants and Conditions; "No Obnoxious, destructive, or offensive activities shall be carried on within any lot or in any unit or in the common areas or any part thereof, nor shall anything be done there which may be or may become an annoyance or nuisance to any other owner or to any person at any time lawfully residing in the project."

We are in a community where neighbors live very close to one another and have very different sleep and work schedules. At no time may residents make noise that can be heard outside their private living quarters, this includes motorcycle noise on streets or garages at any hour. Every resident has the right to undisturbed study or sleep at any hour of the day or night. Please be courteous and considerate of others at all times.

Storage of Items in Common Area

Please do not store any items on common area walkways, on the lawns, planters, or parking areas. Balconies must be free of clutter.
