DROUGHT CONDITIONS WORSEN

LAWN WATERING RESTRICTED BY CITY

Due to severe drought conditions, the city has placed residents on a strict watering schedule. There will be fines for violations. ALSO - by order of the Fire Marshall, absolutely no fireworks of ANY KIND are allowed east of Canyon Road. Not even in your driveway. Not even a sparkler. None.



HOUSE RULES

A FEW REMINDERS

- ✓ No auto repairs may be done in your driveway, on the lawn, or in the street. You may work on a vehicle in your garage, but the door must be closed.
- Put trash cans and recycle bins back into your garage.
- Toys need to be out away and off front porches.
- Christmas lights must be down and any string lights must be clear/white
- ✓ No boats in driveways. Trailers may not be parked in driveway.
- Park in the direction of traffic if on the road and don't block driveways.

ALSO -

Guest parking is strictly for guests/visitors. No resident parking. You will receive a violation sticker for this - and two violations = your vehicle towed.

YARDS: Landscaping services return - the crews will be mowing and trimming on Mondays. Make sure your yards are cleaned up: hoses, toys, etc. off yard and animal feces cleaned up.

HILLS: Local community members will also be working to clean up the wild land directly east of our townhome community.

- YOU are responsible for cleaning up after your pet. There
 are several stations in our community with bags and bag
 disposal containers. Your HOA fees pay for this service.
- Make sure you're licensing your dogs this is city code.
 Cats do not have to be licensed.
- It is your responsibility to keep your dog on leash at all times when outside of your home.
- Dogs may not be tethered to outdoor furniture, front porches, or trees.

DID YOU KNOW?

What is now Cedar Hills sits on a bench (alluvial fan) of the ancient Lake Bonneville. During the Pleistocene period. Lake Bonneville covered much of what is now western Utah and at its highest level extended into present-day Nevada and Idaho. Its highest shoreline (around 18,000 years ago) now comprises much of what is known as the Bonneville Shoreline Trail. It's surface area was ~20,000 sq. miles with a maximum depth close to 1000 feet.

MORE COOL INFO ABOUT OUR AREA:

- Utah Lake is 24 miles long and 12 miles across
- It is the third largest freshwater lake west of the Mississippi
- ➤ Due to its surface area of 96,000 acres and its shallowness (9' avg.), almost 41% of the lake's water evaporates each year
- There were once 10 recreational resorts/spas along the shoreline
- The June sucker fish is native to the lake, can live up to 40 years, and is endangered due to the introduction of the invasive carp
